Renee Bach and daughter Selah Grace Bach

- Renee grew up in Bedford County and was homeschooled from 1st through 12th grade.
 She is the second oldest of five children.
- Renee first went to Uganda as a volunteer for 10 months in 2007 at the age of 18
- After returning home in 2008, she formed the organization Serving His Children (a 501c3 non-profit) and moved back to Uganda in 2009 at the age of 19 where she continues to reside full time and holds the position as the Uganda Programs Manager
- Selah was brought to Renee's home in the fall of 2009 as a two-week old infant. Renee started the adoption procedure in 2010 and it was finalized in 2015.
- Selah became a US Citizen in January of 2017 and will turn 8 on September 29

Serving His Children

- Serving His Children (SHC) became a 501c3 non-profit organization in the US in 2009 and a registered NGO (Non Government Organization) in Uganda in 2010.
- The main office for Serving His Children is in Jinja, Uganda
- Malnutrition Rehabilitation is a concept that breaks the cycle of malnutrition in families and communities by going beyond the traditional medical treatment:
 - Restore the health of the child through medical treatment and nutritional therapy,
 - Empower the family through education
 - Help families and communities find Sustainable solutions to malnutrition
- SHC has provided Inpatient Therapeutic Care for over 1,000 children suffering from severe acute malnutrition since 2010. The average child stays at their facility along with a caregiver for 7-14 days.
- 3,400 families have been served since 2011 through outpatient clinics where they
 receive medical evaluation, therapeutic foods and education. The average family
 participation is from 4-6 weeks.
- SHC partnered with the Uganda Ministry of Health in 2017 to establish the first Rural Malnutrition Rehabilitation Center inside an existing government health center.
- SHC, in partnership with the government, currently offers three programs in the Kigandalo Health Center IV: Inpatient Therapeutic Care, Outpatient Treatment Care and a Supplemental Feeding Program. They are in the process of developing a Community

- Engagement Program to promote a broader reach of education by equipping community leaders.
- As government health care workers and community leaders are trained and the incidence of malnutrition reduced in the district, Serving His Children will gradually phase out their support and seek a new location to begin Rural Malnutrition again.

Ways to help:

- SHC is currently working with about 200 families in the Mayuge district. They need
 additional funding to expand their reach to the whole district and anticipate working
 with 400 additional families.
- The cost to break the cycle of malnutrition in one family is about \$324 and takes about a year of support and training. SHC is looking for more individuals willing to be a #CycleBreaker and donate \$27 a month to cover the expense for one more family!
